



## 2018 Calhoun County Community Foundation Grant Cycle

The Calhoun County Community Foundation (CCCF) grant is now accepting grant applications from 501(c)3 non-profit organizations or government entities for projects that positively impact quality of life in Calhoun County.

Individual grants up to \$5,000 can be used for projects which fall under: arts & culture, community affairs & development, education, environmental protection, health, recreation, historic preservation and human services. Funds are intended for new projects, or for the enhancement or expansion of existing services, programs, or facilities; on-going operational expenses of an organization are not eligible for grant funding.

**\*\* Please note the following changes for this grant cycle\*\***

\* Interested applicants are asked to submit a Letter of Intent, which will include contact information and a brief project summary. Organizations will receive the 2018 grant application one to two (1-2) business days after the submission of their Letter of Intent. The application will be emailed to the same email address that submitted the Letter of Intent. Organizations will not receive the grant application until after their Letter of Intent is submitted to Joe Kuhlman at [joe@fd-foundation.org](mailto:joe@fd-foundation.org).

\* There **will not** be a grant writing workshop for this year's grant cycle. Applicants may contact Joe Kuhlman at [joe@fd-foundation.org](mailto:joe@fd-foundation.org) or 515-573-3176 with any questions about the Letter of Intent, the grant application or grant process.

\* Applicants are **not** required to submit a copy of the latest financial review, audit, 501(c)3 IRS Determination Letter or list of Board of Directors with the applications this year. However, the Calhoun County Community Foundation reserves the right to request these documents at a later date.

If you received a grant in 2017, your final report or request for extension must be submitted by February 6, 2018, or you will not be eligible to receive grant funding in 2018.

The Calhoun County Community Foundation reserves the right to have grant funds returned to the Foundation for projects that are not completed within their stated timeframe. Projects that are not completed may apply for an extension.

The grant application deadline is **Wednesday, January 3, 2018 at 12:00 p.m.**

The Grow Calhoun County (formerly Grow Greene County) grant process will take place after this CCCF grant cycle and is intended for capital projects that exceed \$15,000 in total cost. Entities who plan on submitting an application for the CCCF grant and the Grow Calhoun County grant, may do so, however the applications must be for **different** projects.
